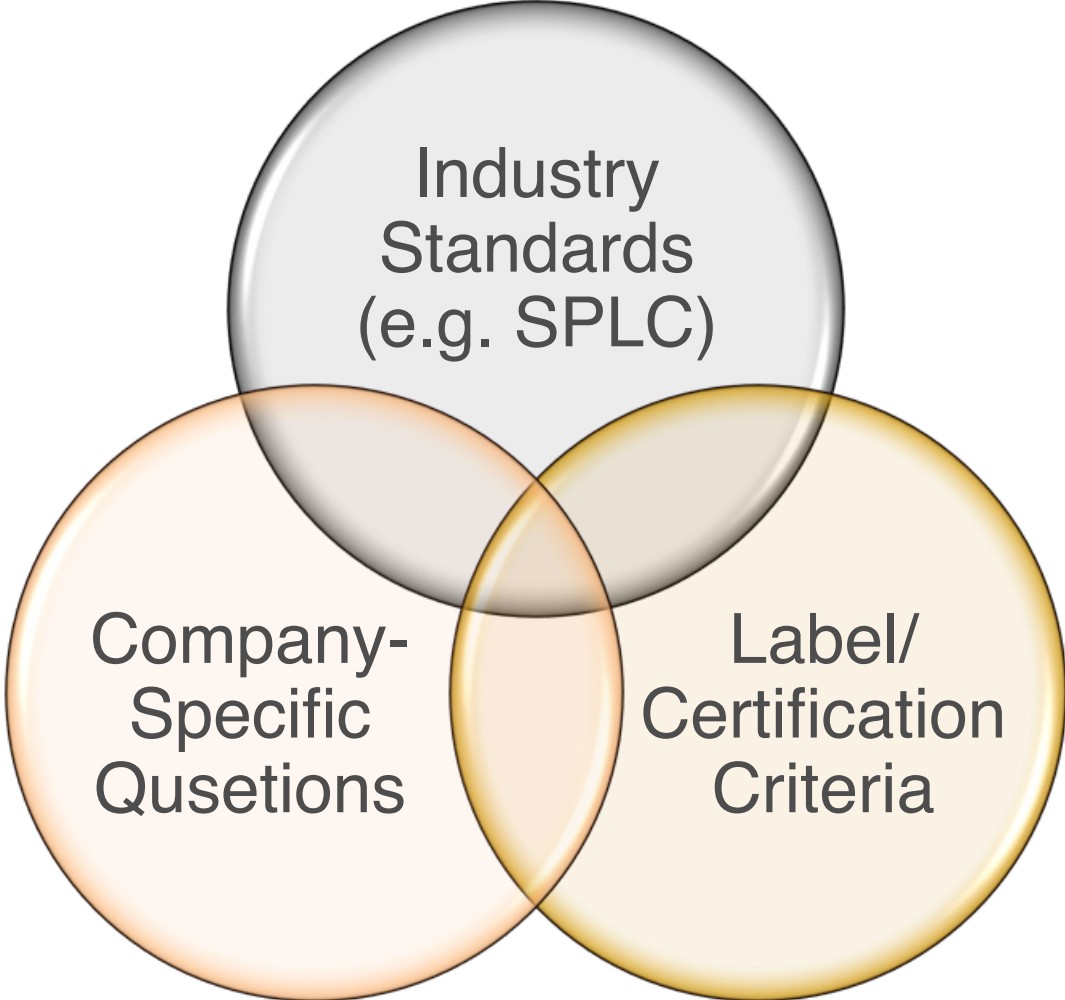
1. Defining goals and boundaries

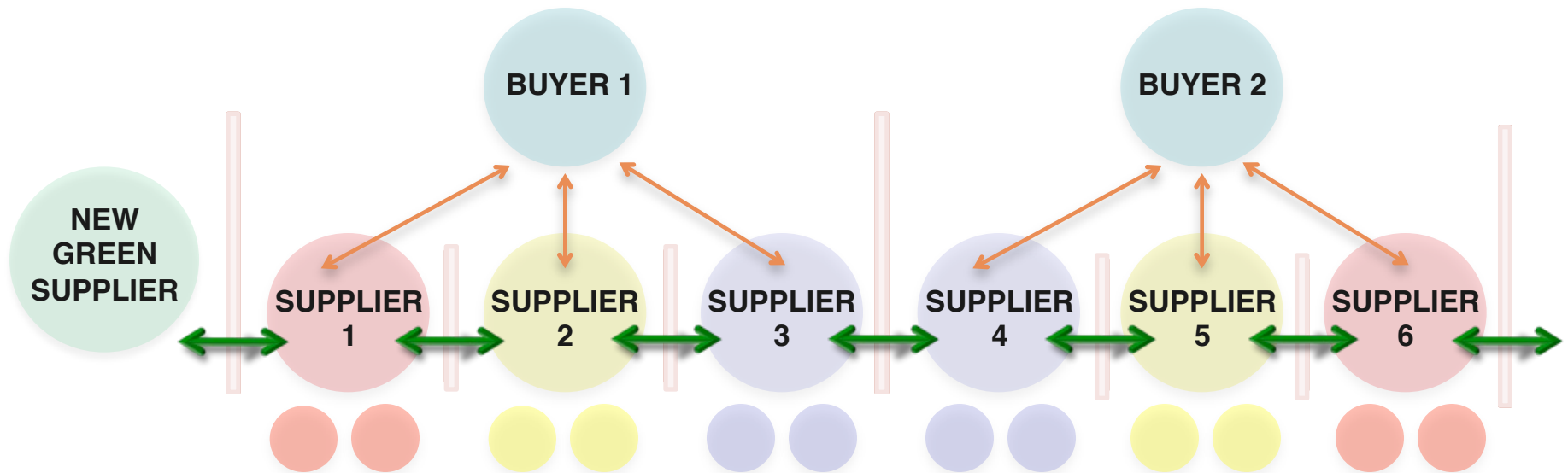

REMOVING ROADBLOCKS TO SUCCESS



Data collection and tracking isn't enough.

Information should be used in smart ways to engage suppliers and motivate continuous supplier improvement.

Initial focus on Life Science suppliers:

- Biggest spend
- High impact

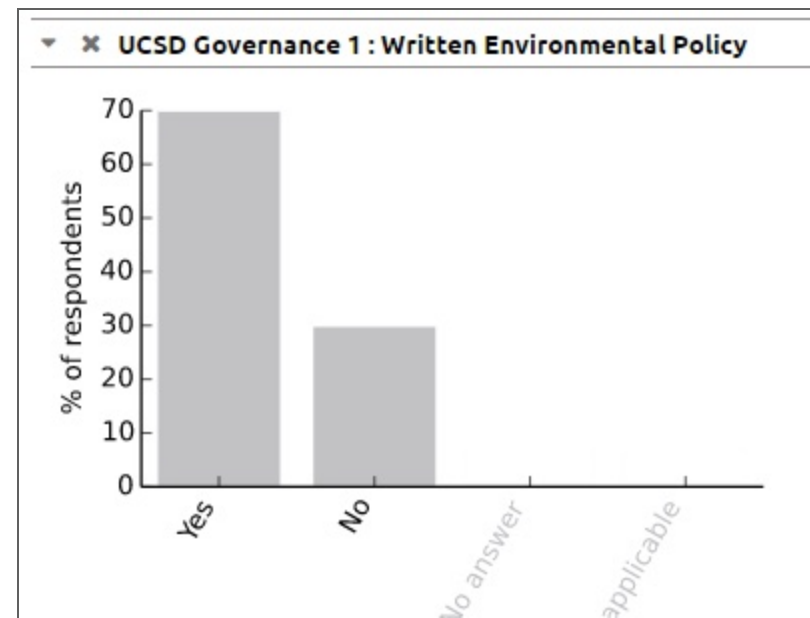
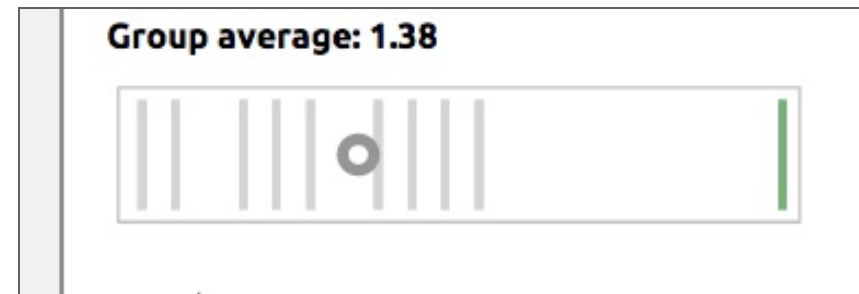
Develop scorecard from SupplyShift Scorecard Library:
